DMR Undertaking Numerous Health and Safety Projects For Public School Buildings

HASBROUCK HEIGHTS -- DMR Architects has been awarded a \$1.5 million contract with the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (NJSDA) to complete various health and safety projects at public school buildings throughout the state.

DMR was selected as one of five firms from more than 40 applicants to provide these services.

While the authority has yet to define specific schools that need repair, all of the projects undertaken by DMR Architects relate to the health and safety of the building's occupants. The scope of services provided by DMR will include replacing and repairing school roofs, upgrading windows and life safety systems as well as HVAC and other mechanical systems.

DMR has extensive experience in working on multiple projects for school construction authorities. The firm was recently awarded an \$8 million from the New York City School Construction Authority for design work at several New York City public schools and is already under a two-year, \$5 million contract with the authority for design services, including development of scope reports, construction documentation and construction administration services for various capital improvement projects.
